Tahoe Truckee Regional Homeless Action Plan Released: A Roadmap to End Homelessness

Tahoe Truckee, CA — The Tahoe Truckee Homeless Advisory Committee (TTHAC), a project of the Homeless Resource Council of the Sierras, has reached a significant milestone in its ongoing efforts to address homelessness in the region. Comprised of twelve partners representing regional jurisdictions, special districts, and nonprofit organizations, the committee has officially released the **Tahoe Truckee Regional Homeless Action Plan**—a comprehensive five-year roadmap aimed at ending homelessness through regional collaboration, compassion, and strategic housing solutions.

The Plan is rooted in key beliefs: **Regional collaboration is critical. Compassion, and accountability is central, housing solves homelessness and doing nothing creates significant economic impacts.** Supported by funding from the **Tahoe Truckee Community Foundation**, the Plan provides a structured approach to tackling homelessness and fostering long-term, positive change within the region.

Developed over 18 months, the **Tahoe Truckee Regional Homeless Action Plan** draws upon **data, insights from individuals with lived experience, and community feedback** to ensure a well-informed and impactful strategy. The Plan emphasizes progress—no matter how incremental—and underscores the importance of **collective action**. It calls upon local governments, organizations, businesses, and individuals to actively participate in providing support and resources to those in need.

A major breakthrough highlighted in the Plan is the introduction of the region’s **first permanent supportive housing solution, lead by Placer County in Kings Beach**. Following extensive due diligence, this initiative represents a transformative step forward in addressing homelessness. **Permanent supportive housing** integrates affordable housing with essential supportive services, enabling individuals experiencing homelessness to maintain stable and secure living environments.

“This Plan is a testament to the power of regional collaboration,” said Nevada County District 5 Supervisor Hardy Bullock. “By working together—across sectors and organizations—we can implement real solutions that help individuals and families secure stable housing and access the support they need.” Supervisor Bullock was one of three co-chairs for the Tahoe Tahoe Truckee Homeless Advisory Committee.

The Tahoe Truckee Homeless Advisory Committee invites community members, stakeholders, and policymakers to review the **Tahoe Truckee Regional Homeless Action Plan** and take part in this collective movement to end homelessness in the region.

Additionally, the full **Tahoe Truckee Regional Homeless Action Plan** document is attached for further review. This detailed report outlines the key strategies, implementation steps, and data-driven insights that shape the region's approach to tackling homelessness.
