- **Critical Reasoning:** Para Jumbles, Odd One Out, Sentence Completion, and Summary-based Questions.

Data Interpretation and Logical Reasoning (DILR)

- **Data Interpretation:** Bar Graphs, Pie Charts, Tables, Line Graphs, and Data Sufficiency.
- **Logical Reasoning:** Seating Arrangements, Blood Relations, Puzzles, Syllogisms, Logical Connectives, and Venn Diagrams.

General Awareness (Primarily in exams like XAT, SNAP, and CMAT):

- **Current Affairs:** Business, Economy, Politics, Science, and Technology.
- **Static GK:** History, Geography, Literature, Sports, and Awards.

EXAM-SPECIFIC SYLLABUS TOPICS

Despite overlapping areas, each exam introduces unique components:

CAT (Common Admission Test)

- Focuses on advanced topics in QA, with higher difficulty in Algebra and Geometry.
- Reading Comprehension heavily emphasizes inference-based and critical-thinking questions.
- No sections for General Awareness or Decision-Making.

MAT (Management Aptitude Test)

- Includes a dedicated Indian and Global Environment section covering current affairs and static GK.
- Logical Reasoning includes unique areas like Symbol-Based Problems and Input-Output Sequences.
- QA questions are simpler compared to CAT.

XAT (Xavier Aptitude Test)

- The decision-making section is a standout, testing problem-solving in ethical dilemmas, business scenarios, and situational analysis.
- Occasionally includes an Essay Writing section requiring structured and analytical responses.
- Greater focus on Critical Reasoning within Verbal Ability.

SNAP (Symbiosis National Aptitude Test)

- Features speed-based questions with a higher number of items and tighter time constraints.
- General English includes Idioms, Phrases, Proverbs, and Foreign Words.
- Analytical and Logical Reasoning demands precision in diverse formats like coding-decoding and series.

NMAT (NMIMS Management Aptitude Test)

- Offers adaptive testing where difficulty levels adjust based on responses.
- Key focus on Language Skills, Quantitative Skills, and Logical Reasoning, with no negative marking.

CMAT (Common Management Admission Test)

- It includes an additional Innovation and Entrepreneurship section that encourages creativity and strategic thinking.
- The GK component combines current affairs and static topics.
